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Information leaflet on classes with specific language regimes (classes à régime linguistique spécifique - RLS classes)

After the third year (9e class) in the lower cycle of technical secondary education, pupils move on to the fourth year (10e), where they embark on training to prepare them for working life. Classes are often taught in German, which presents a problem for many pupils, for whom classes with specific language regimes (RLS classes) offer a real chance of success.

An RLS class is one in which all lessons, except language lessons, are carried out in French. The programmes of education and training are exactly the same as for other classes. For those training courses for which learning German is compulsory, pupils have the choice of two levels – beginner or intermediate – when they start in 10e.

The Ministry of Education, Children & Youth has published an information leaflet giving details of these special classes, for the benefit of learners and their parents.
